The specific objectives are: (i) reflect on ways to connect Law and other areas of knowledge; (ii) contribute to public and private policies based on the discussions; (iii) capacity building of interdisciplinary professionals. Outcomes: The main outcomes are: the diffusion of scientific researches on the sustainable management of marine resources in a simple and accessible way through live broadcast; the proposal of policy briefings related to the discussions. These reports will be released by Natural Resources Law and Sustainable Development Research Group (GERN) of University of Brasília and addressed to the civil society and to institutions that work on the issue; the capacity building of students that are better prepared to communicate with people from other areas of knowledge. Activities: The proposal is to hold 33 webinars on themes related to the sustainable management of marine resources in 3 years (1 per month except January). This programme will be a continuation of the webinars that have been organized by GERN from July 2020 to December 2020. Some examples of subjects that have already been discussed are: "The challenges of implementing the due diligence obligation in the context of sea exploration", "ODS and Decade of the Ocean", "Artisanal fishing communities in the legal context of Brazilian marine protected areas", "International Law of the Sea and Exploration of the Seabed from a Socioeconomic Perspective", "Environmental licensing as an instrument for an integrated management of mineral resources in the Brazilian marine space" and "Marine biodiversity beyond national jurisdiction (BBNJ)". The webinars format will be as follows. The student author of the PhD or Master's degree theses will present the work previously sent to the participants. After the presentation, the guests (teachers, managers and operators from law and other areas of knowledge) will make comments in the following sense: barriers to understanding the text (due to the legal language, for example); connections between law and other sciences; what is the use and how to connect the work. The initiative was totally designed within the context and framework of the Ocean Decade and based on the Brazilian workshops, a collaborative process held to build up the national plan for the Ocean Decade. Always with science as a base, the initiative will address 3 main challenges, related to 1. "Goods and services threatened by disorderly tourism"; 2. The everyday program will start with thematic symposia covering major themes in reef and ocean sciences (e.g., the human dimension of reefs, ecological synthesis, artificial reefs, oceanic islands and reef conservation). Debates quorum will be composed of scientists, communicators, reef users (fishermen, community and youth leaders), lawyers, entrepreneurs and managers discussing themes such as the sustainability in the Anthropocene, reef restoration, deep-sea challenges and opportunities, anthropogenic impacts on reefs, sustainable tourism in reefs, scientific communication, equity in reefs, ocean literacy and challenges in a reef science career. One session will be dedicated to the interaction with the next generation of reef explorers, where specialists will answer questions from Brazilian students. Finally, we also have dedicated asynchronous sessions for art expression, and scientific work presentations (pre-recorded videos on YouTube) associated with interactive sessions with authors. Our aim is to bring qualified information to the general public and stimulate the debate of important themes that concerns all citizens in an informative manner using lay language but scientific rigorous facts. We also intend to bring it in an easy and accessible way using largely accessible media (YouTube) to broadcast and host the event for free. At last, we are starting a campaign to create public engagement by sharing through social media personal testimonies about individuals' experiences and their connection with the oceans. These will be short videos (1 minute long) in which people can add comments and tag friends to stimulate them to participate and, indirectly, increase awareness about the ocean and how deeply connected we all are with it. We will use the hashtag #oMarChegouAqui, which translates to 'the ocean got here' in an allusion to when people got aware and touched by the oceans in any special sense.

It protects and feeds us, distributes winds and rains, regulates temperatures and fertilizes the planet. It is home to thousands of life forms. It brings us peace, joy and rest and is a source of infinite cultural inspiration. But it is not inexhaustible. The sea is dirty and tired, almost without strength to recover. Its waters are warmer, more polluted and its richness is being squandered. Something needed to be done. It is in this context that Scientific American Brazil and the UNESCO Chair for Ocean Sustainability, linked to the University of São Paulo (USP), through its Oceanographic (IO-USP) and Advanced Studies (IEA-USP) institutes, took the initiative to hold an annual Ocean Week in São Paulo, the Marina Week, a great festival to celebrate the sea and discuss crucial issues for the future of the ocean. The event will be held between June 1st and 5th, at Memorial da América Latina, in São Paulo. The project is mainly focused on the sea/coastal bird community that inhabits the Canto do Itaipu region, in Praia Grande, an area that is part of the Xixová-Japuí State Park and the Marine Environmental Protection Area of the Coastal Center of São Paulo, in the municipality of Praia Grande, metropolitan region of Baixada Santista. The place is considered of vital importance for coastal, resident and migratory birds - such as terns and gulls, for example - as it is one of the only points in the region where birds can have moments of rest and body care without human interference. (FORESTRY, 2010 and 2019). The objectives of the project are, following the principles of Oceanic Culture (UNESCO, 2020), to know and recognize the diversity of the local coastal avifauna, the dynamics of this community and from there to think and act on actions that change this dynamic. Each of the objectives presents a set of sequential activities (conversation rounds, research, field trips, seminars, production of field guides, among other activities) that are related and result in practical conservation actions in the place. It is expected that at the end of the project students will be able to identify the species in the region, understand the relationships between species, environmental factors and people and the ability to verify impacts and propose actions to mitigate them.
